Fuel Poverty - Definition



the situation in which a household would have to spend more than 10% of its income on fuel to maintain an acceptable level of temperature throughout the home

The Fuel Poverty Factors



- Low Income
- Increasing Energy Prices
- Energy Inefficiency

Fuel Poverty Statistics



- **Fuel Poor Households –203,000 (33% of all households 2001 HCS)**
- **50% (101,500) households aged 60 +**
- **27% (54,810) households with children including two thirds (68%) of lone parent households**
- **73% are households without children including:**
 - 41% lone adult households (30,270)**
 - 56.2% lone older households (52,910)**

Fuel Poverty Statistics



- 2004 Interim House Conditions Survey shows number of households in fuel poverty reduced from 203,000 to 153,530.
- Alongside unprecedented increases in oil, gas and impending electricity costs.
- DTI estimate that a 10% in energy prices plunge 8,000 households into fuel poverty.

Fuel Poverty and Health



Some Statistics

- **2000** cold weather related deaths annually (DSD)
1360 Older People (DSD)
- **£40M** cost to the NI NHS (1991 figures)

Growing causal link e.g.

- Asthma
- Respiratory conditions
- Ischemic heart disease
